

Megapixels & Printing

Recommended size for Printing

MP (megapixel) setting:	Will give you GOOD quality prints at:	Will give you BETTER quality prints at:	Will give you BEST quality prints at:
1 MP	5" x 7"	4" x 6"	Wallet
2 MP	8" x 10"	5" x 7"	4" x 6"
3 MP	8" x 10"	8" x 10"	5" x 7"
4 MP	11"x 14"	8" x 10"	5" x 7"
5 MP	11" x 14"	11" x 14"	5" x 7"
6-7 MP	16" x 20"	11" x 14"	8" x 10"
8 MP	17" x 22"	16" x 20"	8" x 10"
10 MP	20" x 30"	17" x 22"	11" x 14"


- Displaying your pics
 - Matting and framing –still the best option
 - Digital frames
 - Photo albums

- Post Production
 - File maintenance
 - Come up with a method –NOW before it's too late.
 - There are as many methods as there are photographers. Use one that works for you!
 - Treat your pics as one of a kind works of art.
 - · Back 'em up.
 - NEVER edit the original –only copies

- Create a folder with a date code and description
 - YYYY_MM_DD Description
 - 2016_03_23 First Day of Photo Class
 - Will always be in chronological order
- Download your pics from the camera to this folder
 - May need to create and move to other folders
 - Different Dates of Subjects
 - Try NOT to keep pics in Camera for too long!
 - Uses up valuable memory card space
 - Vulnerable to loss!

- Copy all pics from this folder to a backup
 - External hard drive
 - CD or DVD
 - Maybe both!
- Only <u>AFTER</u> pics are downloaded and backed up:
 - Delete them from the memory card in the camera
- NEVER change the file name of the pic
 - Causes confusion
 - Descriptive names lose value over time (after 150 files with the name "Little Johnny149")

- NEVER edit and save over original file
 - Place the edited copies in a separate file folder instead
 - I often have sub-folders for edited and re-sized pictures

- Post Production
 - Photo Editing
 - Fixing your mistakes
 - Exposure
 - Enhancing detail
 - Adding contrast
 - Adding effects
 - Enhancing the image

- The computer can perform Magic…
- But not Miracles!
 - Can't bring out detail that is just not there
 - Too Over/Under Exposed
 - Focus errors
- The best practice is to get it right in the camera
- Think of the "Digital Darkroom" as a safety-net
 - Not the first line of defense




f-Stop: *f* 5.6


f-Stop: f 10 Shut

f-Stop: f 10 Shutter Speed: 1/200 ISO: 100

• Over Exposure -Before



f-Stop: f 8

Shutter Speed: 1/13

ISO: 200

Over Exposure -After



f-Stop: *f* 8.0

Shutter Speed: 1/13

Over Exposure-Before



f-Stop: f 5.6 Shutter Speed: 1/60 ISO: 320

Your Next Camera


- Always keep the one you have (unless it's broken)
